GUIDE FOR LAIDLAW GRADUATE STUDENTS – AUCKLAND



Laidlaw Graduate School students may borrow up to 30 items for 4 weeks with the option of 2 renewals. You can request and renew items online. You need to “login” to the Catalogue to use this function. See Library staff if you need to set up a password.

Desk Copies

These can only be used in the Library and are issued for up to 2 hours. They cannot be renewed or reserved.

Short Loan Material

These are issued for 7 days and they can be reserved. **Overdue Short Loan material** that is not returned by the due date will incur a \$5.00 charge.

Recalls

We will “recall” an item when it has been requested by another borrower or by the Library. If the book is not returned within 3 days after a recall notice is issued, a \$5.00 charge will be incurred.

Photocopying and Printing

In order to print from the IC computers you need to select the document you want to print and press print as normal. At the copier you will need to swipe your ID card to release the print job. You will also need to swipe your ID card when photocopying.

Please note that photocopying is 10c per sheet for black and white, 50c per sheet for colour. There is a coin machine on the ground floor of the Library which allows you to top up your card. If you are wishing to use eftpos, you can top up your card at reception.

E-Books

We have a growing E-Book collection that can be accessed via the One Stop Search.

Simply enter the keyword “ebooks” into the basic search box on the One Stop Search screen and this will list all available titles. You can then display the full record by clicking the title, and from there you can click the URL to open the E-Book link. You will then be asked to login using your provided Username and Password to access the work, which can either be read online or downloaded (Adobe Digital Editions is required for this).
