

WHERE YOU CAN STUDY

Laidlaw is a national college, with campuses in Auckland and Christchurch, and learning sites across the country, as well as opportunities to study our programmes via distance.

With a range of full-time and part-time options for in-person, online or study through our many partnerships, students can pick a mode of study that suits them, and can mix modes to match their other commitments.

ON CAMPUS STUDY

For those near Auckland or Christchurch, study on one of our campuses offers rich formative community, with opportunities to engage directly with lecturers, support staff and other students, study spaces, community meals and events, extra seminars and lectures, and regular chapels, prayer, and worship.



Auckland Campus

Our Auckland campus is located in the heart of Henderson, adjacent to a transport hub. The Waitākere Ranges and west coast beaches are close by. Students enjoy vibrant community life supported by purpose-built facilities, well-equipped lecture rooms, and an extensive and well-resourced library.

Christchurch Campus

Our Christchurch campus sits in the north western suburb of Papanui, in a custom-designed building that celebrates learning, community, and creativity. The smaller campus and class sizes make study at this campus relationally rich, supported by a great library, and a comfortable lounge where students and staff can take a break or work together in small groups.



PARTNER COLLEGES

As an interdenominational college, Laidlaw is committed to working in partnership with colleges, churches, non-profits and local communities, to provide a diverse ecosystem of learning where particular denominational and other distinctives can flourish, and where students can access learning that draws on both Laidlaw's nationwide faculty and support, and the particular strengths of our partners.

Along with flexible learning locations, we also offer flexible study opportunities. You may want to study just for interest, gaining skills to help you navigate your faith in our cultural context, or going deeper into certain topics of interest. Or you may prefer to study for credit, enrolling in a programme and working towards a qualification.

Any of our theology courses can be taken as interest only courses. From time to time we hold workshops, Wānangas, and invite you to kōrero or talanoa with us.

Conferences are another way we invite you to join us. These are opportunities to delve into a wide range of topics, hosted by faculty across our Theology, Counselling, and Teacher Education programmes.

Bible and Theology

Studying theology is about seeking wisdom to live faithfully in the world. Theological study at Laidlaw builds on our strengths in biblical study, systematic theology and formation, and is ideal for those who are seeking to deepen and integrate their faith into every area of life, as well as those preparing for professional Christian ministry.

Mission and Ministry

Laidlaw College was founded on the idea of Christian mission, and continues to focus on the clear, compelling, and faithful communication of the Good News of Jesus Christ for the world. Modern mission studies now incorporate intercultural studies and missional theology, preparing and equipping students for this third millennium. All our theology programmes integrate the realities of our bicultural context as we seek to explore, learn, and live out the Gospel in Aotearoa.

Teacher Education

Our teacher education programmes provide fully-accredited preparation for teaching in primary, intermediate, and secondary schools. Uniquely in New Zealand, our courses are taught by experienced teacher-educators and by theologians, who will help you ground your professional practice in the Gospel of faith, hope, and love, and to engage with children and youth as people made in the image of God.

Christian Leadership

Our Christian leadership programmes are designed to combine practical experience in mission and ministry with theological study and formation. Students are mentored by established leaders, and serve in church or ministry contexts, while studying in preparation for lifelong leadership in church, cross-cultural mission, or communities.

Christian Thought and History

We see the Gospel as relevant to every walk of life, and offer courses in Māori and Indigenous theology, Pacific Theology, Christian History – with a focus on the history of Aotearoa New Zealand – and courses that prepare students to think about their faith in their vocational contexts.

Counselling

Our counselling programme prepares students to serve others through healing hearts, minds, and relationships. Christian thought and practice is integrated throughout the programme, with a uniquely immersive mix of classroom, practicum, group, and mentored learning. This qualification is for those who want to build a career in counselling, or those who want to develop lifelong skills for working with people.

BACHELOR OF COUNSELLING (BCouns)









The Bachelor of Counselling is a three-year degree designed for students who want to integrate Christian faith with a range of sound, well-established counselling theories, and practical skills. This degree prepares you to become a registered counsellor with either the NZ Association of Counsellors or the NZ Christian Counsellors Association. It has a common core of biblical, theological, and philosophical studies which provides a foundation for a deep appreciation of the Scriptures, and the outworking of the Gospel in life and professional practice.



Admission Requirements

Minimum Age

BCouns applicants

All BCouns applicants must be at least 20 years of age on or before the first day of semester in which the proposed programme of study is offered.

Entry Assessment

For applicants who do not meet the above requirements, an Entry Assessment may be required.

- Includes a literacy test.
- · Dates for assessment will be advised.

Special Admission

Possible study options can arise depending on the assessment result:

- Entry to Bachelor of Counselling (if appropriate).
- An offer of entry to a level 5 programme.

Professional References

Applicants are required to submit written references from two referees. Referees should not be a close friend or relation and should be able to answer questions about the applicant in a ministry and/or professional capacity.

Selection Interview

All applicants who have successfully completed the first stage of the application process will be provisionally accepted into the programme and invited to attend a group interview and, if required, a further interview by a panel of two selectors.

Police Clearance

It is a condition of enrolment that students complete a Police Vetting Service Request and Consent form as part of their application.



The Graduate Diploma in Education (Secondary) qualifies students to register as teachers in New Zealand intermediate, middle and secondary schools, in public, integrated, and private schools. The Graduate Diploma builds on the subject expertise gained in a previous Bachelor's degree or equivalent, drawing on a richly integrated theology, and including at least 16 weeks in schools on professional placements.

Become a Primary School Teacher

Laidlaw's Bachelor of Education (Primary) provides a deeply formative pathway to becoming a registered primary teacher in Aotearoa, immersed in Aotearoa's unique cultures, and involving a mix of on-campus learning in Auckland or Christchurch, and professional placement in schools or centres. The programme is richly integrated with the Bible and Christian theology, and aims to produce inspiring, creative and curious primary school teachers serving the next generation.

BACHELOR OF EDUCATION (PRIMARY) (BEd)









The Bachelor of Education (Primary) is a Teaching Council of Aotearoa New Zealand approved three-year professional degree preparing students for primary teaching (Years 0-10) in New Zealand. Graduates are eligible for registration and can teach at primary, or intermediate level in state-integrated and private schools throughout New Zealand and around the world.

The degree combines theory and practice in dynamic, interactive on-campus learning environments and includes over 24 weeks of school-based practice. Students think vocationally about teaching and have opportunities to reflect theologically on their practice throughout the degree.

Admission Requirements General Admission Requirements

Entry to the Laidlaw College Bachelor of Education (Primary) is New Zealand University Entrance or a recognised equivalent (i.e. International Baccalaureate or Cambridge International), or to demonstrate to the satisfaction of Laidlaw College that they have the skills and ability to study at a tertiary level.

Students applying to the BEd without UE must be able to demonstrate to the satisfaction of Laidlaw College that they have the ability to study at a tertiary level.

Students 20 years or older must meet literacy and numeracy requirements comparable to those entering with UE. This will be assessed by the entrance literacy and numeracy testing.

Entrance Test Requirements

All applicants are required to have a selection interview and sit entrance tests that focus on literacy and numeracy skills.

Candidates must score step 4 in the TEC literacy (reading and writing) assessment to enter the programme. Candidates must score step 6 in the TEC numeracy assessment to enter the programme. Candidates who score step 5 in the TEC numeracy assessment may be granted entry into the first year of the programme but must score step 6 before entering the second year.

Special Admission Requirements

For applicants who do not meet the requirements, possible study options can arise depending on the assessment and interview result:

• An offer of entry to an alternative level 5 programme.

Professional References

Applicants are required to submit written references from two referees. Referees should not be a close friend or relation and should be able to answer questions about the applicant in a ministry and/or professional capacity.

Selection Interview

All applicants are required to have a visual interview by panel. The interview determines:

- The applicant's ability to meet the Code of Professional Responsibility (in a supported environment).
- The applicant's disposition to teach, through judging their ability to meet the values that underpin Our Code Our Standards
- Vulnerable Children Act risk assessment (interview component) AND
- Other relevant matters

Police Clearance

All applicants must complete a Police Vetting Service Request and Consent form as part of their application. All international applicants for the BEd must provide a police clearance certificate from their country of citizenship AND for any country in which they have lived for more than a 12 month period in the last 10 years. This overseas police clearance should be less than 6 months old and be presented at the time of application. This is to meet the requirements of the Vulnerable Children Act 2014.

Charged with an offence

Any Laidlaw College student teacher charged with an offence must disclose the charge in writing to the Head of School - Education within 3 working days.

GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN EDUCATION (SECONDARY) (GradDipEd)









The Graduate Diploma in Education (Secondary) is a one-year professional graduate diploma (level 7) and prepares graduates to meet the Code and Standards for the Teaching Profession. You will develop a robust understanding of secondary teaching and learning, reflection, and research as a teacher. The delivery of the degree is site-based with modes: face-to-face delivery, blended learning, and practicum. This qualification will suit people who are excited by the idea of working alongside teenaged students, who show a disposition to teach, and already have a Bachelor's degree qualification or higher.

Admission Requirements

General Admission Requirements

The normal requirement for admission requires applicants to show evidence they have:

- An appropriate Bachelor's degree at Level 7 on the New Zealand Qualifications and Credentials Framework and/or postgraduate qualification, AND
- A body of knowledge from Levels 5 to 7 or higher in support of New Zealand Curriculum learning areas for at least one Year 7-10 teaching subject/s and at least one Year 11-13 teaching subject/s, OR
- For language teaching: native or fluent reading, writing, speaking, and listening in the language.

Entrance Test Requirements

All applicants are required to have a selection interview and sit an entrance test that focuses on literacy and numeracy skills.

Candidates must score step 4 (or equivalent) in the TEC literacy (reading and writing) test and step 5 in the TEC numeracy test for full entry into the course.

Professional References

Applicants are required to submit written references from two referees. Referees should not be a close friend or relation and should be able to answer questions about the applicant in a ministry and/or professional capacity.

Selection Interview

All applicants are required to have a visual interview by panel.

Police Clearance

All applicants must complete a Police Vetting Service Request and Consent form as part of their application. All international applicants for the GradDipEd must provide a police clearance certificate from their country of citizenship AND for any country in which they have lived for more than a 12 month period in the last 10 years. This overseas police clearance should be less than 6 months old and be presented at the time of application. This is to meet the requirements of the Vulnerable Children Act 2014.

DIPLOMA IN CHRISTIAN STUDIES (DipCS)











This qualification provides you with an introduction to Biblical studies, theological studies, and spiritual formation. It prepares you to live out the Gospel of Christ, engaging thoughtfully and compassionately in the world. There are two programmes leading to two strands. All the courses are built on a foundation of biculturalism.

Diploma in Christian Studies (Christian Leadership)¹

Diploma in Christian Studies (Theological Studies)²

Through the **Christian Leadership** strand[†] you'll learn to evaluate and deliver ministry programmes within your context, to think deeply about your faith, and to lead a wide range of Christian operations. You will build a biblical and theological foundation to which you can apply Christian leadership skills through real life practical contexts.

The **Theological Studies** strand will give you an introduction to biblical studies, theological studies, and spiritual formation, and will prepare you to live out the Gospel of Christ, engaging thoughtfully and compassionately in the world.

Students who complete the DipCS may staircase into the second year of the Bachelor of Theology degree.

BACHELOR OF THEOLOGY (BTh)











The Bachelor of Theology is designed to provide students with a solid foundation in biblical studies, theological knowledge, and reflection. GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN THEOLOGY (GradDipTh)











The Graduate Certificate in Theology and Graduate Diploma in Theology are designed for those who already have an undergraduate qualification. They bring vocational expertise and life experience into dialogue with critical reflection on the Christian faith. Students studying in these programmes will deepen their theological understanding and discover connections between theology and the wider world, the Church, and missions contexts. Completion of the GradDipTh provides a potential springboard into postgraduate study. Graduates from these programmes have returned to their vocations, engaged in missions or community development, worked in local and global contexts, trained as teachers, or moved into church leadership.



Admission Requirements

General Admission Requirements

The normal requirement for admission into the GradCertTh and GradDipTh programmes is a completed undergraduate degree, or higher qualification, as defined in the New Zealand Qualifications and Credentials Framework of the NZQA.

Special Admission

Serious consideration will be given to those who have a combination of relevant experience and non-degree qualifications. This is particularly relevant for those whose qualifications are at a level that, in the current New Zealand environment, is likely to be regarded as having been gained at degree level. Each application will, however, be considered in light of the applicant's overall background and ability to benefit from the programme. The onus is on the applicant to provide details of all qualifications and experience relevant to the application procedure.

POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN THEOLOGY (PGCertTh)











The Postgraduate Certificate in Theology (PGCertTh) programme provides an advanced level theological qualification for those who have already completed a recognised Bachelor's level or a Graduate Diploma qualification in Theology. The PGCertTh programme consists of two taught courses.

POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN THEOLOGY (Ministry Supervision) (PGCertTh(MinSup))









As ministry in the contemporary world becomes increasingly complex, regular access to professional supervision is vital. Successful completion of the PGCertTh (Ministry Supervision) (PGCertTh(MinSup)) will assist graduates in meeting the supervisory needs of people in a range of ministries, as well as professionals in other helping vocations. It is a part-time programme comprised of two successive courses, each 30 credits at level 8, to be completed in order, although not necessarily in the same year.

POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN THEOLOGY (Theology for Education) (PGCertTh(TE))











The vocation of teaching is complex in our current cultural moment. Christian teachers have to be aware of current best practice in the classroom and the conversations shaping the way we understand faith and spirituality. It is a part-time programme comprised of two successive courses, each 30 credits at level 8, to be completed in order, although not necessarily in the same year.

POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN THEOLOGY (PGDipTh)











The Postgraduate Diploma in Theology (PGDipTh) programme provides an advanced level theological qualification for those who have already completed a recognised Bachelor's level or a Graduate Diploma qualification in theology. The PGDipTh programme consists of taught courses. Also, students who successfully complete taught courses in the MTh programme amounting to at least 120 credits, but who do not complete a research project, may be awarded the PGDipTh.

BACHELOR OF THEOLOGY (Honours) (BTh(Hons))









The Bachelor of Theology (Honours) (BTh(Hons)) one-year programme recognises distinguished study at undergraduate level (level 7). This is a programme of study for those who have successfully completed three years of undergraduate study in theology and want to extend this into graduate level research and writing at level 8.

MASTER OF THEOLOGY (MTh)









The Master of Theology (MTh) is a one to two-year (full-time equivalent) 120 or 240 credit degree. It provides an advanced level theological qualification for those who have already completed a recognised Bachelor's level degree in theology (or in another subject area plus a recognised bridging programme into Theology, eg: GradDipTh) and want to upgrade their qualification in a specific area or extend their understanding of Theology and Christian ministries. The degree provides opportunity for Master's level biblical and theological study related to the fields of Biblical Studies, Christian Thought and History and Pastoral, Missional and Contextual Studies, and for students to pursue a research project in an area of interest.

• The 120-credit MTh is available for those who have completed the PGDipTh or the BTh(Hons).

Advanced Research Degrees and Doctoral Programmes

Laidlaw offers a pathways to doctoral study through partnerships. Laidlaw faculty can co-supervise students enrolling in the Doctoral of Philosophy (PhD) in Theology at the University of Otago. As an affiliated college of the Australian University of Theology (AUT), Laidlaw students can enrol in a number of AUT postgraduate programmes, including the Doctor of Ministry (DMin) and the Doctor of Philosophy (PhD).

Admission Requirements

General Admission Requirements

The normal requirement for admission into the Bachelor of Theology (Honours) programme is a completed three-year undergraduate degree in theology or Christian ministry or equivalent qualification, as defined in the New Zealand Qualifications and Credentials Framework of the NZQA, in an appropriate discipline. Entry into the Bachelor of Theology with Honours is conditional upon:

- A grade point average of 7.5 (B+) in courses of the qualifying undergraduate programme at NZQA levels 6 and 7; and
- · Approval of the Postgraduate Lead.

The normal requirement for admission into the PGCertTh, PGDipTh, and MTh programmes is a completed undergraduate degree, or higher qualification, as defined in the National Qualifications Framework of the NZQA, in an appropriate discipline. The following options are available:

- Completed Bachelor's qualification in theology or Christian ministry OR
- Applicants who hold a recognised Bachelor's level degree in a
 discipline other than theology may be accepted for study towards
 the PGDipTh or MTh following successful completion of a bridging
 programme of theological study, such as those provided by
 Laidlaw or as approved by the Postgraduate Committee. Bridging
 requirements may be satisfied wholly or partly by credit transfer
 and/or recognition of prior learning.

A grade average of 7.0 (B) or higher in courses of the qualifying undergraduate programme equivalent to NZQA levels 6 and 7 is required.

Special Admission

Serious consideration will be given to those who hold qualifications of an equivalent standard. In exceptional circumstances the Postgraduate Committee may allow applicants who do not meet these requirements, or who do not have qualifications of an equivalent standard, to be granted provisional candidature into the PGDipTh. Candidature in the MTh shall be confirmed after the satisfactory completion of the PGDipTh.

Each application will, however, be considered in light of the applicant's overall background and ability to benefit from the programme. The onus is on the applicant to provide details of all qualifications and experience relevant to the application procedure.



SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

Laidlaw College provides access to a number of scholarships and bursaries for students studying in New Zealand. All are annual unless otherwise stated. Scholarship award decisions will be made on the basis of a completed application form by the Laidlaw Scholarships Committee. Scholarship applications for the following year must be received by the 1st day of December each year.

Completing an application does not guarantee you will receive a scholarship. Decisions regarding the awarding of scholarships are affected by available funds, quality of applications, and number of applicants in a given year.





ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must meet both the Academic and English language requirements for their programme. In addition to the requirements outlined, applicants for whom English is not their first language must use one of the following methods to demonstrate that they have the required level of English proficiency to study in New Zealand:

- Gained NCEA Level 3 and met New Zealand University Entrance requirements; or
- Holds a Bachelor's degree of at least three years from New Zealand, Australia, Canada, the Republic of Ireland, South Africa, the United Kingdom, or the United States of America; or
- Achieved a Certificate in English Language Teaching to Adults (CELTA); or
- Achieved the required score, as indicated in the following subsections, in one of the following internationally recognised English proficiency tests, within the preceding two years:
- International English Language Testing System (IELTS)
- University of Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English (CAE)
- University of Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE)
- University of Cambridge First Certificate in English (FCE)
- International English for Speakers of Other Languages qualifications by City and Guilds (IESOL)
- Pearson Test of English (Academic) (PToE)
- New Zealand Certificate in English Language (NZCEL)
- Testing of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)

A waiver for the English language test may be granted if applicant has:

- Completed all primary education (equivalent to New Zealand school years 1 to 8) and at least three years of secondary education (equivalent to school years 9 to 13) in schools in New Zealand, Australia, Canada, the Republic of Ireland, South Africa, the United Kingdom, or the United States, where English was the language of instruction.
- Completed at least five years of secondary education (equivalent to New Zealand school years 9 to 13) in a country listed in rule 22.5, where English was the language of instruction.
- Been awarded a tertiary qualification (such as a Bachelor's, Graduate Certificate or Diploma, Honours, Postgraduate Certificate or Diploma, Master's, or Doctoral degree) taught in English from a provider in New Zealand, Australia, Canada, the Republic of Ireland, South Africa, the United Kingdom, or the United States.

Please note that these waiver requirements do not apply to the Bachelor of Education (Primary) and Graduate Diploma in Education (Secondary). Applicants should refer to the Laidlaw College website for details: www.laidlaw.ac.nz/admission-requirements

The Application Process

The application process may take some time so it is essential that you make an early start.

When embarking on study abroad there are a number of factors that will support your application to Laidlaw and your time here in New Zealand:

- We like to know that you come with the full backing and support of your church, both in prayer and finances. It is a privilege for us to have a part in training people from around the globe, but it makes a significant difference to have this training recommended and supported by your church.
- It is also important that you have sufficient funds to cover all costs involved for
 the duration of your study. These include your airfare, insurances, tuition fees,
 and accommodation costs for each year of your proposed programme. Obtaining
 part-time or holiday work is not guaranteed, so it pays to look at sourcing finances
 within your own country before arriving. In the process of obtaining a visa your
 financial position will be looked into.

Once you have found the programme you would like to apply for, take your time to answer all questions carefully and feel free to forward any queries to our Admissions Team (admissions@laidlaw.ac.nz).

When we have received your application and supporting documents, your application will be considered by the Admissions Team and you will be notified of the result by email. If successful, you will be given full details of fees payable, a medical insurance quote, an Offer of Place, and programme details.

The Offer of Place and receipt of fees paid will form part of your visa application. You can apply online for a Student Visa/Permit on the Immigration NZ website: www.immigration.govt.nz.




