

Student Services Fee

Laidlaw College charges a Student Services Fee to fund key services to students.

The services aim to provide support in the areas of wellbeing, community, retention and achievement.

More specifically the following areas of support are offered:

Careers

Staff involvement with career development and advice, including Mission week, Church at Large Week, Pasifika Inspire, advertising of job opportunities through a weekly e-newsletter, mentoring, and consultation with potential employers to transition students into post-study employment, and advice on further study pathways.

Counselling/Pastoral Care

Provision of counselling services, facilities to encourage conversation and wellbeing (common rooms, café spaces). Community events to foster community (eg. Community lunches, cultural concerts, chapel services), non-academic support provided by academic and operational staff, provision of Deans on some campuses.

Financial Support/Advice

Hardship assistance, needy student support fund, administration of these and various scholarship funds and supporting applications for external funding.

Sports, Recreation and Cultural Facilities

Funds help towards the upkeep of recreational facilities, and the cost of cultural and community events, community lunches, student leader retreats and training, and student leadership oversight.

Laidlaw College's Student Leadership Team provides leadership to students and represents student interests. The Student Leadership Team is consulted on the level of the fee (maximum to be charged), and the types of services the fee covers. The consultation also covers the method of authorisation and the way the services are provided.

The Service Funding Report on the following page details the agreed 2025 Student Services Fee level and the income and expenditure for each type of student service. The student services fees are separately accounted for in the College's accounting system.

Student Services Fee 2025

The Student Services Fees rose in 2025 in accordance with a recommendation from the Student Leaders. For “on campus students” this is \$504 (\$4.20 per credit) per Equivalent Full Time Student. For distance students this is \$63 per student per semester. The last increase was in 2012.

Laidlaw College’s elected Student Leadership Team provides leadership to students and represents student interests. The Student Leadership Team are happy to receive input into decisions around the Student Services Fee, and/or students may comment in student surveys that are issued from time to time.

The Student Leadership Team is consulted on the level of the fee (maximum to be charged), and the types of services the fee covers. At their regular meetings, reporting or feedback can be given.

Student Services Fee 2026

Laidlaw College and the Student Leadership Team consulted in August/September 2025 and agreed the following:

1. That the fee for 2026 remain unchanged.
2. That the 2026 Fee be allocated (as per the previous year) to:
 - (a) Careers, information, advice and guidance – 9%
 - (b) Counselling Services/pastoral care – 35%
 - (c) Financial Support and advice – 16%
 - (d) Sports, recreation and cultural activities – 40%.

It is understood circumstances change from year to year so actual expenditure may vary between categories.

Laidlaw College’s elected Student Leadership Team provides leadership to students and represents student interests. The Student Leadership Team are happy to receive input into decisions around the Student Services Fee, and/or students may comment in student surveys that are issued from time to time.

The Student Leadership Team is consulted on the level of the fee (maximum to be charged), and the types of services the fee covers. At their regular meetings, reporting or feedback can be given.
